CURBSIDE COLLECTION

796 Tons Garbage
340 Tons Recycle

collected by our fleet of four garbage trucks. 29% of curbside collection or recycle items was diverted from the landfill.

85 tons more garbage was collected at the curbside this year. As more people used curbside collection to avoid visiting the Transfer Station due to COVID-19.

BAG TAG SALES

\$430,000

Since January almost 87 bundles or 219,686 bag tags were sold. Last year at this time, only 42 bundles were sold. There are 2,500 tags in each bundle.

LANDFILL OPERATION

19,531 Tons of municipal solid waste was disposed at the landfill. This is 18% less than last year! Take a look:

BIG BELLIES

Solar Smart Waste Receptacles

Garbage and recycle items are collected in Big Bellies in the downtown, Kenora Recreation Centre, Lake of the Woods Discovery Centre and other public spaces. In 2020, the Big Bellies were emptied 1,860 times: 36% recyclables, 64% garbage

RECYCLING

899 Tons = 62 Trailer Loads of recyclable waste material transported to Winnipeg in 2020 - 428 tons of cardboard, 412 tons of comingle (blue box items), and 59 tons of paper.

The City also transported 536 tons (37 trailer loads) of Dryden's recycle to Winnipeg.

2020 CAPITAL PROJECTS

To provide reliable service, we need to regularly replace aging equipment.

In 2020 we purchased:

- 2 Garbage Trucks: \$597,387
- Recycle Compaction Trailer: \$271,505
- 4 Big Bellies: \$30,000
- Concrete pad under recycle canopy: \$29,600

2019 Projects Completed:

- Aggregate pit
- Extension of scale building

THE TRANSFER STATION

Open every day, except holidays, for drop off of garbage, construction materials, recycling, electronics, reuse items, leaf/yard waste, and more.

RECYCLE DEPOT

Recycle Depot was busy all summer, with the most visitors after the long weekend in August with 503 people, and the least on July 28 with 233 people.

326 Tons of Recycle
651 Tons of Garbage
70 Tons of Glass

Plus: 288 tons of commercial recycle collected from different commercial contractors.

HAZARDOUS WASTE

The Household Hazardous Waste Depot was open from July 23 to October 15 this year due to COVID-19 on Thursdays from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.

In total, 39 tons of HHW was diverted from the landfill this year:

- Paint: 13 tons
- Aerosols: 2 tons
- Flammables: 6 tons
- Used oil: 10 tons
- Oil containers: 2 tons
- Other: 6 tons

OTHER DIVERTED WASTE

- 31.3 tons of electronic waste
- 88 tons of scrap metal
- 5.2 tons of lead acid batteries
