Kenora Bicycle Routes

Kenora is bike friendly! Our recreational routes have been created to maximize safety and get cyclists to great scenery and points of interest. Recreational routes are in the form of loops which start and end at the Lake of the Woods Discovery Centre, Kenora's visitor information centre. Each recreational route is identified by a coloured dot on the bike route signs. You can combine the routes in order to create the ride of your choice.

1 Anicinabe Park

This route follows the Kenora waterfront, past the downtown area and loops through the Lakeside neighbourhood. The route highlight is Anicinabe Park where there is camping, swimming and a small store at the park entrance.

2 Rabbit Lake

This route travels to the round-about and through the railroad underpass. The route proceeds along Veterans Drive and then onto Rabbit Lake Road. The route circles Rabbit Lake and passes Garrow Park and beach area. The route includes a 500 m section of paved, off-road nature trail known as Rotary Way. A short offshoot from Veteran's Drive takes you to a nice viewpoint along the Winnipeg River.

3 Laurenson Lake

This route travels along the Kenora waterfront and through downtown Kenora. The middle of the route, on both the outbound and return loops passes by some of Kenora's busiest shopping areas. The highlight is the beautiful country riding along Transmitter Road and the old railroad rock cut along Gould Road.

4 Round Lake

This route is an extension of the Rabbit Lake and Laurenson Lake Routes. It passes by Round

Lake along Airport Road and then travels along the rolling country hills of Homestake Road. The route returns to Kenora along Transmitter Road. This route includes classic Kenora country scenery and lots of small rolling hills.

6 Keewatin Route

This route heads west from the Discovery Centre into the historic village of Keewatin. The route passes through downtown Keewatin and returns along Beach Road where you can see some magnificent waterfront homes. In Keewatin there is opportunity to stop for lunch or ice cream, hike the Mink Bay Wetland Trail, or explore some out-of-the-way quiet roads.

6 Jones Road

For those cyclists who want to travel further afield within the City of Kenora, the Jones Road and Airport Road loop makes a nice ride. This ride is approximately 36 kilometres. Start at the Discovery Centre and travel east on the Anicinabe Park loop. At Canadian Tire, head east out of Kenora on Highway 17. After approximately 10 km, turn left (north) on Jones Road. Travel along Jones Road turning left on Airport Road just before the Kenora bypass (Hwy 17A). Follow Airport Road back into Kenora returning on the Rabbit Lake Route.

Commuter Routes

These do not have route signs but have share the road signs to remind cyclists and motorists of their responsibilities.

Longer Rides

Other longer rides include the Anderson-Carlton loop (approximately 30 km) and the Coker-Redditt Road loop (50 km). There are many other country roads worth exploring. Just grab a map and start pedalling!

Safety Considerations


All normal cycling safety precautions should be observed. The safest way to use the roundabout is to occupy a full lane as you approach and continue to occupy a full lane until you exit the roundabout. Cyclists who are not comfortable with this may walk their bikes on the sidewalk.

Kenora has a number of bridges which are pinch points for cyclists. Cyclists not comfortable with the limited space are encouraged to walk their bikes on the sidewalk. Kenora does not have much of a rush hour but you can maximize your cycling enjoyment by avoiding peak traffic periods.
